

# HJALMAR SCHACHT, FRANZ VON PAPEN, AND HANS FRITZSCHE


Charles collected the signatures of Hjalmar Schacht, Franz von Papen, and Hans Fritzsche on the day of their acquittals at Nürnberg.



Hjalmar Schacht  
1.10.46.

Hjalmar Schacht was a key Nazi fundraiser, and was economics minister and Reichsbank president until relieved of power by Hitler. Schacht grew increasingly uncomfortable with the "illegal" acts against Jews and spoke out publicly.


Schacht's involvement with the Nazi's was deemed too early to be tied to the war crimes.



Franz von Papen  
1.10.46

Franz von Papen was Hitler's vice-chancellor, and served as ambassador to Austria and then to Turkey after the Anschluss. He was charged with conspiring to start WWII.

As with Schacht, von Papen's Nazi involvement was deemed to have occurred too early to be tied to the war crimes.



Hans Fritzsche

Hans Fritzsche served on the staff of the Ministry for People's Enlightenment and Propaganda as Joseph Goebbels's radio propaganda chief.

Fritzsche was deemed to be just a "talking head," not worthy of a jail sentence.
